

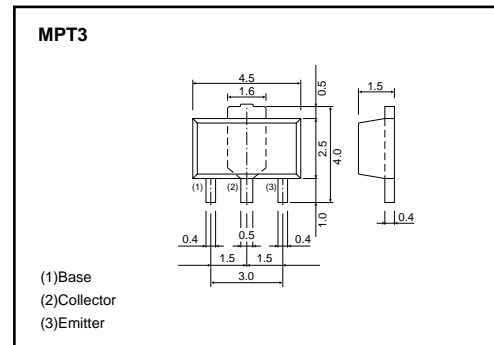
# Medium Power Transistor (60V, 2A)

### ●Features

- 1) Low saturation voltage , typically  
 $V_{CE(sat)} = 0.13V$  at  $I_C / I_B = 1A/50mA$ .
- 2) Collector-emitter voltage =60V
- 3)  $P_c = 2W$  (on  $40 \times 40 \times 0.7mm$  ceramic board).
- 4) Complements the 2SB1561.

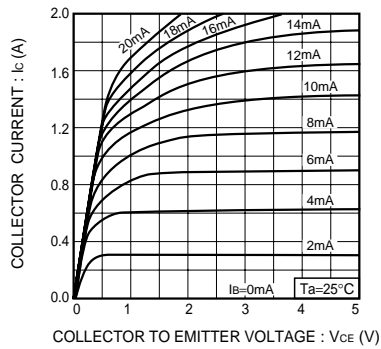


Fig.1 Grounded emitter output characteristics

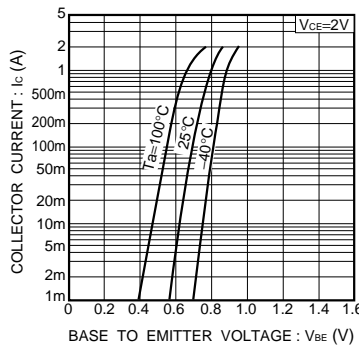


Fig.2 Grounded emitter propagation characteristics

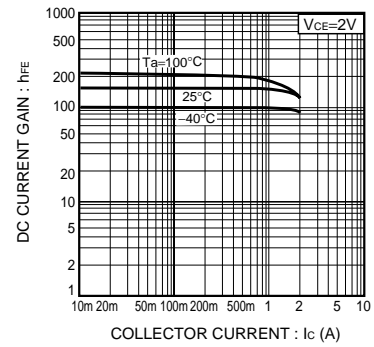


Fig.3 DC current gain vs. collector current ( I )

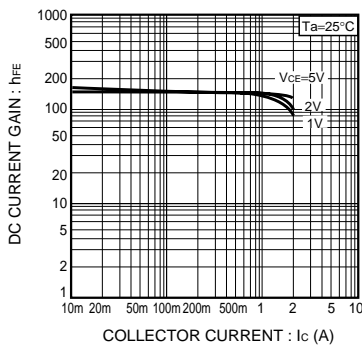


Fig.4 DC current gain vs. collector current ( II )

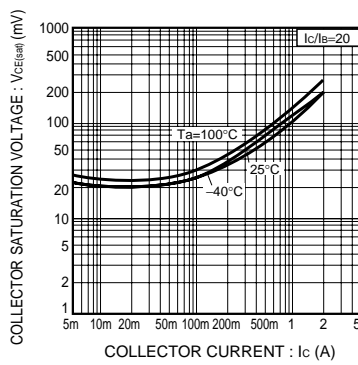


Fig.5 Collector-emitter saturation voltage vs. collector current ( I )

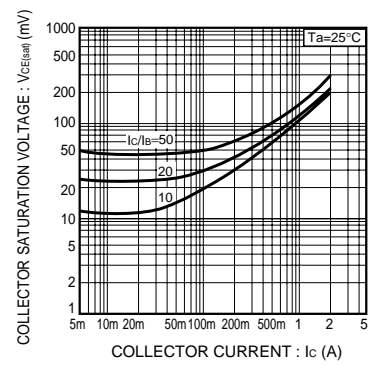


Fig.6 Collector-emitter saturation voltage vs. collector current ( II )

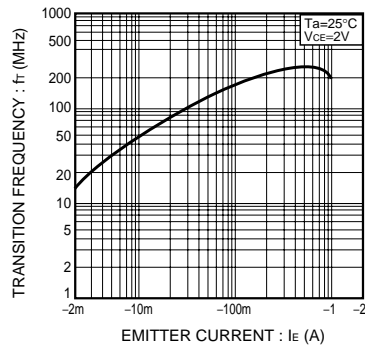


Fig.7 Gain bandwidth product vs. emitter current

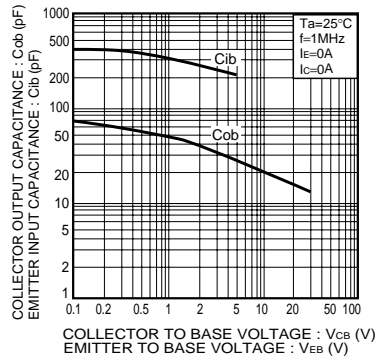


Fig.8 loutput capacitance vs. voltage

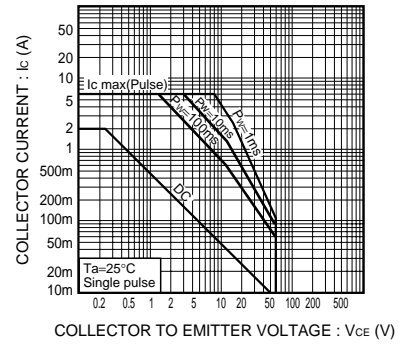


Fig.9 Safe operating area

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
